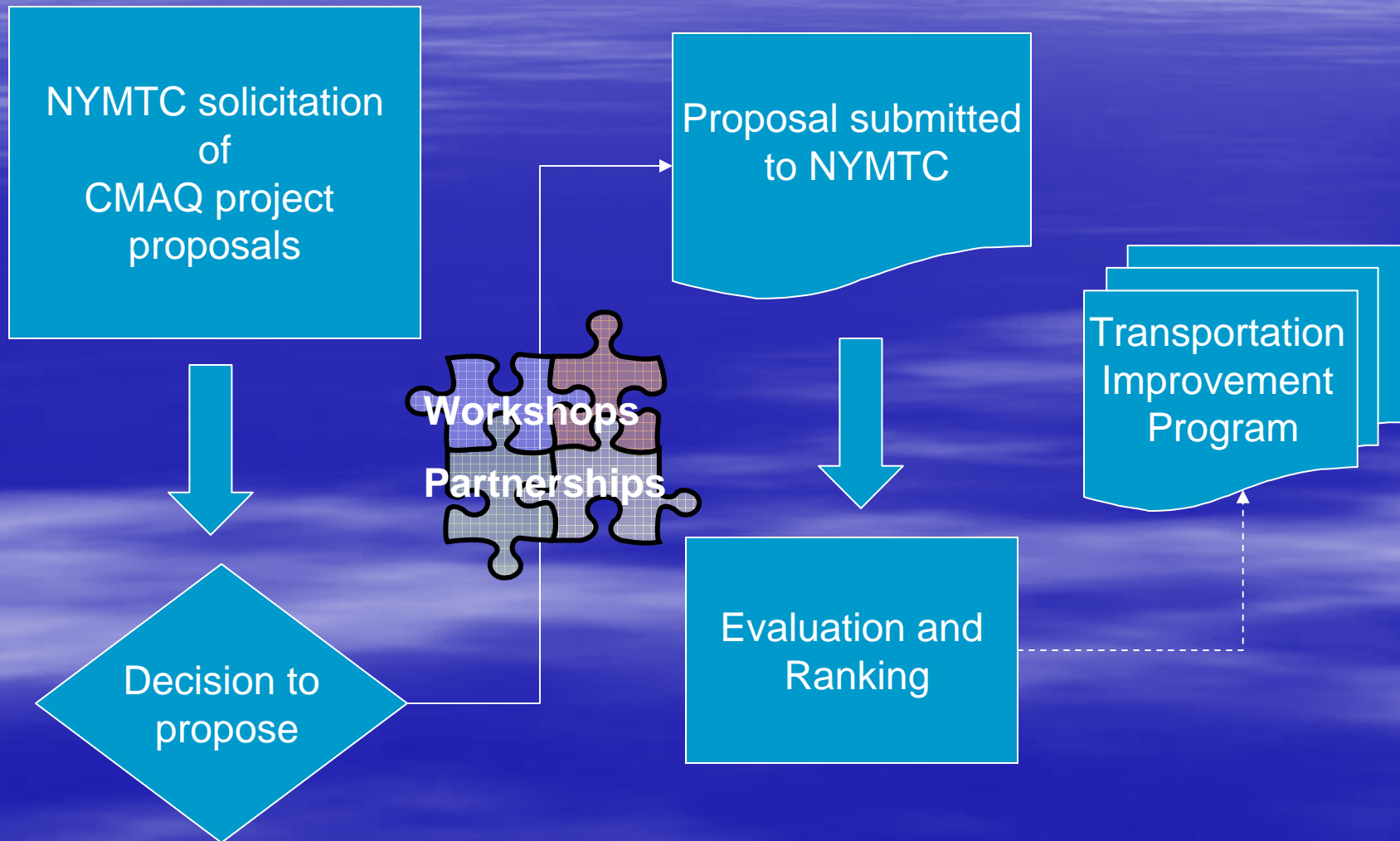

What Is a Successful Project?

- Proposed by an agency, municipality, NGO or fleet operator ***or some combination***
 - Defined in sufficient detail to allow for evaluation of air quality impacts ***and*** for assessment of organizational arrangements
- Ranked sufficiently high among all proposals received in terms of air quality benefits
- Selected for inclusion is a Transportation Improvement Program

What Are the Steps to Success?



Example of Success: Long Island

- PROJECT: Alternative Fuel Sanitation Trucks; Town of Smithtown, NY
 - Greater Long Island Clean Cities Coalition
 - Receives CMAQ funding
 - Solicited for projects regionally
 - Assisted with technical aspects
 - Town of Smithtown
 - Proposed project
 - Procurement: approximately 20 trucks
 - Operations and logistics

Examples of Success: New York City

- PROJECT: Hunts Point Market Fleet Modifications
 - Largest food distribution center in Northeast
 - Multiple private fleets
 - Targeting approximately 800 trucks (500 in initial phase)
- New York City Department of Transportation
 - Proposed project
 - Sponsorship (with NYC Economic Development Corporation)
 - Assisted with technical aspects
 - Applied for planning money -- Green Fleets Study
- Hunts Point Economic Development Corporation and Community Board 2
 - Planning for transition
 - Logistics with private operators
 - Fueling station
- Private Fleet Operators

Examples of Success: Hudson Valley

- Westchester County Bee-Line System; Alternative Fuel Buses
 - Westchester County
 - Proposed project
 - Sponsorship
 - Procurement: 84 hybrid electric vehicles
 - Operations and logistics
